Town Justice- The judges’ reports for September have been received by the Town Supervisor.

Legislator – Margaret Kastler reported that the Oswego County Legislature meets at 2 pm on October 13th. They will be voting on the dog quarantine local law effective through April 30, 2017. A committee will be voting to accept the town’s payment for 99 Weaver Road and then the full legislature will vote. The town should have ownership before the November regular meeting. The county sent the highway contracts out to the towns. The cost to attend Camp Hollis will be increasing as operating costs have gone up. The legislature is working on the county budget.

Library- Director Jessica Godfrey presented the latest newsletter to the Town Board. On October 28th Finding Paranormal, a ghost hunting group from Pulaski, will hold a presentation and investigate the library from 6 to 7:30 pm. On October 29th a Halloween Party will include a kids’ craft and a Garfield movie. There has been a large number of visitors each month in the library. In August 1,136 patrons visited. The board was provided with a graph comparing library visits in 2015 and 2016. The highway department will repair the stairwell and hallway. Stanley Steamer did a nice job cleaning the carpet.
